To help the public service spend wisely

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INTRODUCTION

- 1. This report covers the period 1st July to 30th September 2024.
- 2. This quarter was marked by business disruptions. It started with the passing of what became Hurricane Beryl in early July and finished with the passing of tropical storm Helene in late September. Both weather systems caused widespread flooding in Cayman and consequent work disruptions. In addition, I was absent from work for a large part of the quarter while receiving medical treatment overseas. Deputy Auditors General, Winston Sobers and Angela Cullen acted during my absence.
- 3. During the quarter, we continued working on backlogged audits and began planning for the 2024 financial audit season. We held our annual audit launch event followed by technical training on accounting standards run by CIIPA in mid-September.
- 4. No performance audit reports were issued during the quarter although the report on the Regen waste management procurement was sent to Parliament following the Government's decision to pull out of that contract negotiation. The civil service confirmed that commercially sensitive information was included in the report that dated from December 2021 on the morning of its planned publication. Therefore, the Office deferred making the report public at that point, although it was subsequently leaked to the media. The report remains unissued.
- 5. We supported the PAC hearing on our report *Improving employment prospects for Caymanians* on 5th September 2024.
- 6. The quarter was a heavy one for recruitment with the appointments of a Caymanian Audit Trainee and two Audit Project Leaders. In addition, the Governor started the recruitment process for my successor following my resignation.
- 7. Details of other activities undertaken and achievements during this period are given throughout the report.
- 8. I am committed to continuing the practice of providing the PAC with regular updates on the Office's operations to suit the PAC needs. We currently report to the PAC quarterly and subsequently make these reports available on our website.

FINANCIAL AUDIT PRACTICE

ENTITY AUDITS - 2024

9. During the quarter we began preparing for the 2024 financial audit season by reviewing budgets for 2024 jobs and the fees chargeable to clients. We kicked off the 2024 season by having a retreat to discuss the 2024 audit approach, global audit considerations and other matters on 19th and 20th September at UCCI. Technical update training on the IPSAS and IFRS accounting standards offered through CIIPA was scheduled for 23rd and 24th September but this training was halted after day one due to the imminence of Tropical Storm Helene. Immediately after these events, audit staff began holding kick-off meetings with their clients to plan for the 2024 audits prior to interim audit work being undertaken during the next quarter.

BACKLOGGED ENTITY AUDITS

- 10. During the third quarter, we gave a clean opinion to Cayman Airways for their 2023 audit meaning that 40 out of 46 entity audits are now completed for 2023.
- 11. Work is well progressed with the preparation of the General Report on the 2023 financial audits and this should be sent to Parliament early in the next quarter before being made public after that.
- 12. The 2022 audit for National Housing Development Trust (NHDT) was also completed during the quarter and given a clean opinion.
- 13. At the end of the September, 14 prior year audits were outstanding for six entities. The backlogged audits are:
 - the Ministry of Planning, Agriculture, Housing, Infrastructure, Transport and Development, NHDT and the Maritime Authority of Cayman Islands for 2023 only;
 - Cayman Turtle Centre for the two years 2022 and 2023;
 - CIAA for the four years 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023; and
 - the Ministry of Health for the five years 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023
- 14. Exhibit 1 overleaf provides a high-level summary of the state of audit completion as at 30 September 2024 for the five years from 2019 to 2023.

- 16. Appendix A (pages 13–14) provides a status update on all 2023 audits as at the date of this report. A more detailed update on the progress on individual audits for prior years is contained in Appendices B through E on pages 15–23 with a definition of audit terms given in Appendix F on page 24.

ENTIRE PUBLIC SECTOR (EPS) AUDITS

- 17. During the quarter, we continued the audit of the consolidated EPS financial statements for 2021 and work will continue into the next period.
- 18. Exhibit 2 below shows the status of EPS audits as at 30 September 2024.

PERFORMANCE AUDIT PRACTICE

- 20. Quarter three was a busy quarter for work on performance audits.
- 21. During the quarter, we continued planning and fieldwork on several performance audits and progressed the reporting on others. The status of the performance audit programme at 30 September is detailed in Exhibit 3 below.

REPORTS REVIEWED BY PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE (PAC)

- 22. During this quarter, the PAC held a witness session on our performance audit *Improving employment prospects for Caymanians* on 5th September 2024. The hearing considered several issues raised in the report including: the strategic direction and legal framework, employment programmes, WORC's online jobs portal and performance, and barriers to and opportunities for employment.
- 23. On the same day, the PAC also held an administrative meeting. At that meeting the Committee considered our Q2 report, and updates from the Cayman Turtle Centre and Judicial Administration on progress since previous hearings.

OPERATIONAL REPORT

OAG FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE FOR THE PERIOD ENDING 30 SEPTEMBER 2024

- 24. During this quarter, the OAG's 2023 annual report was tabled in the Parliament by the PAC Chairman on 24th July 2024.
- 25. At the end of the September 2024, the office continued to be under budget on personnel and operating costs. Our revenue also continues to be under budget. The table below provides detail. The third quarter financial performance shows a deficit of \$54,617. It is worth noting that the budgets are simply profiled in twelfths whereas our operating expenses and income are spent and received less consistently during the year. October and November will be heavy billing months as we go through our planning and interim audit work for the 2024 entity audits and so revenues will increase next quarter. We will continue to monitor our financial performance throughout the remaining months of the year in order to try to ensure that we achieve a small surplus.

OAG STRATEGIC PLAN PROGRESS

- 26. During the quarter the recruitment for the next Auditor General commenced with tests and interviews scheduled for October 2024. The finalisation of the strategic plan for the period 2024 to 2028 is on hold awaiting the appointment of the new Auditor General so they can have an input into it. In the meantime, the strategic objectives in the 2019-2023 strategic plan roll forward as the mission, vision, values and work of the office endures. This can be accessed on our website www.auditorgeneral.gov.ky.
- 27. I was on extended sick leave for several weeks during the quarter whilst in Miami receiving medical treatment. Deputy Auditors General Winston Sobers and Angela Cullen covered for me. Winston attended the Government's quarterly Audit and Risk Committee meeting and the PAC administrative meeting. Angela acted for me at the PAC hearing in September, undertook interviews
 - for the Deputy Ombudsman in late August and represented the office at the UK Overseas
 Territories annual Forum in
 London during September. The
 Forum covered a range of topics including good governance,
 scrutiny, financial management,
 effective relationships between
 Auditors General and Public
 Accounts Committees, audit developments and audit quality management.



- 28. The OAG's five-year lease for accommodation at Anderson Square ends in the next quarter. With the increase in audit work as a result of the OAG taking more work in-house from the firms, the accommodation has become increasingly tight. The three Deputy Auditors General and Corporate Services Manager viewed several properties during the summer months to assess whether OAG should renew their lease or move to new accommodation. However, the decision was taken to renew the Anderson Square lease, do some further office reconfigurations and hire larger board room facilities as necessary for all staff meetings.
- 29. During the quarter, we continued to make good progress with our new quality management approach. Deputy Auditor General, Patrick Smith, and Audit Manager, Julius Aurelio, started undertaking cold reviews of OAG recently completed audit files. These will drive quality improvements in line with best practice and international standards.

30. We continued to develop our IT audit strategy and capability through the INTOSAI IDI LOTA programme and to work on corporate and practice related IT enhancements during the quarter. The significant achievement in this quarter was the launch of the upgraded OAG website following a tendering exercise.

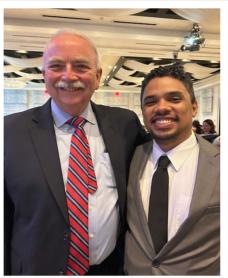

- Undertake planning and interim works for the 2024 entity financial audits.

- **Disclaimer** I was not provided with sufficient information to conduct an audit.

The definitions of the audit status are as follows:

- Substantially Complete Financial statements submitted/audit fieldwork complete
- In Progress Financial statements submitted/audit in progress
- In Planning Audit being planned / Financial Statements submitted but likely to be incomplete or missing supporting schedules.
- **Not Started** Financial statements submitted/audit not started due to operational matters such as outstanding prior year audit(s)
- **Pending sign off** Financial statements are fully reviewed and just final sign off of documents required.
